

Message from Priest **Daniel Saldarriaga Molina**

Executive Director



In 2021, Bogota Food Bank (BAB) turned 20 years since the beginning of its work inspired by Pope St. Juan Pablo II and promoted by Cardinal Pedro Rubiano Sáenz Rubiano. Nowadays, thanks to the support of thousands of people, we are a national reference in battling against hunger; hundreds of people and companies entrust us with their resources because, with equity and respect, we support millions of Colombians in vulnerable situations. This report is full of positive and inspiring news that we present today with great satisfaction.

In 2021, we had an agile and dynamic first semester and a relatively tough second semester, but we endured it with effort and perseverance. This year, thanks to the work of more than 970 dedicated and committed organizations, the immeasurable support of 3,899 volunteers, 47 universities, 1957 students and responsibility of 130 collaborators, we were able to support almost 600 thousand people and deliver 18,5 million kilograms of products.

A year in which many extraordinary things happened to us. While the world continued to be surprised by the Covid-19 pandemic, we saw the arrival of thousands of donors that allowed us to multiply by five the number of people we helped, doubling the number of kilograms of products moved throughout the country. The clear and efficient processes we have, allowed us to adjust and reacted according to the context needs, closing 2021 with positive and kind figures in an environment that concerns the world crisis. I am referring in particular to the hunger crisis that the world is experiencing. and that the FAO has clearly and forcefully reminded us of its existence.

We are concerned about the poverty statistics and its consequences on hunger. Today, we see the difficulties of our beneficiary organizations: Non-attendance of their beneficiaries and a decrease in their donations, affecting their operations. Pope Francis has said that poverty is not the fruit of fate but the consequence of selfishness, and he constantly reminds us not to lose sight of the opportunity to do good.

We are celebrating 20 years of our existence with the opening of the two warehouses that we acquired in 2019, but were only able to adapt this year. With the goodwill of a group of benefactors, who prefer to keep their names confidential, we acquired the rights to a warehouse in Corabastos. A 139-meter double-height warehouse will allow us to be much more efficient and effective in our task of recovering fruits and vegetables. Overthere we have the constant support of the management and the commitment of more than 1,000 merchants.

The generosity of Viva Air Airlines continues to allow us to reach remote areas of the country where, for humanitarian reasons, we have delivered more than 39,602 kilograms of products.

The ongoing support and professionalism of TBWA agency has allowed us to count on El Tiempo, Caracol Television, Caracol Radio, and La W, among other media companies, to successfully spread our message. I also

would like to mention that, thanks to the creativity and generosity of Miguel de Narváez, we now officially have a jingle for the Bogotá Food Bank.

We counted with the auditing services of Ernst & Young, which shows a healthy legal situation for the BAB. There are no lawsuits against us, ensuring due compliance with all the legal standards governing labor, commercial, and tax aspects. In compliance with the provisions of Law 603 of 2000 on Copyrights and Intellectual Property, we certify that the software that we use for the processes is supported by the respective license of use. There have been no events affecting the BAB's financial information.

The exceptional guidance of the Archbishop of Bogota, Luis José Rueda Aparicio, the commitment of our Board of Directors have allowed us to exceed our expectations once again. The leadership and vision of each of the board members and our donors generosity, motivate us every day to work harder to restore the social tissue that has deeply deteriorated in Colombia, due to the pandemic.

A year with many uncertainties lies ahead, and this is when we must take the risk of acting differently to respond to so many who need us. Once again, I invite you to join us in this task that unites us, to ensure that food in Colombia becomes a right, not a privilege.





PRODUCT RECOVERED IN 2021 3,015,318 kg

Since 2016, Bogotá Food Bank (BAB) has presence in Colombia's largest market and the second largest in Latin America. Every day, a group of 12 collaborators supported by volunteers go through more than 6,300 stores of this Marketplace in search of products to be recover from disposal. Fruits, vegetables and greens vegetables are given a second chance, ending up not in the garbage, but in the hands of the most vulnerable populations from our city.

The last 6 years of uninterrupted journey, the BAB has recovered around 14.000 tons of food that used to end up in a dumpster. Additionally, our work allows us to respond to the Sustainable Development Goals No. 12 and 13 on responsible consumption and production, waste reduction, pollution and climate action. In this way, we continue to work tirelessly fighting against hunger.





Day by day, we strive to expand our network of allies to strengthen small producers, in particular those who are part of PREA, our program for the Recovery of Agricultural Surpluses, who with drive and dedication, give their best to put the service of thousands, his desire to help and his spirit of solidarity.

The future of large cities depends on sustainability. The BAB not only works to help the vulnerable population but also wants to be an important actor against waste and its impact on the environment of our city. Today it is imperative that we all be aware that recycling is not an option, it must be an obligation. Our daily commitment is to treat waste in the best way to protect the environment. For this reason, we have managed to create alliances with recyclers, composting and other waste companies, to strengthen the work we do.

Annually we rescue thousands of kilos of food suitable for human consumption, which are used by our beneficiaries. On the other hand, by optimizing our processes, since 2019 we began to measure our carbon footprint, annually reducing Co2 emissions, water use and unnecessary energy consumption in our operation.


During 2021 we have a team of 130 committed collaborators, who day by day, adding efforts, dedication and work, deliver the best of each one, transforming wills and making us stronger.

Sanitary Emergency by Covid-19

The proper management of the Covid-19 pandemic has undoubtedly been one of the greatest challenges that the world has had in recent years. Taking into account that our operation has not stopped a day since the start of the pandemic in March 2020, it has been a complex and challenging issue for us. Our priority has been the well-being of employees and their families, always bearing in mind that thousands of people depend on our support to survive.

To mitigate and contribute to reducing the negative impact of this pandemic, we adopted the biosafety protocol for the management and control of the risk of Covid-19, issued by the Ministry of Health and Social Protection, through Resolution 777 of 2021.

We highlight that, within the internal management of the health emergency, the adoption of the National Vaccination Plan was promoted, achieving 100% coverage of the collaborators, in addition, the periodic taking of Covid-19 tests was maintained as a measure to avoid contagion. massive in our facilities. Today, all our collaborators are vaccinated and we have not had any human loss within the BAB team
